

HANDICRAFTS SECTOR AT A GLANCE

- 
- Handicrafts is one of the oldest and largest sector in J&K in terms of employment
 - District Samba enjoys Patent rights over the Calico Printing and Bamboo Crafts.
 - Handicrafts Department Plays a catalytic Role in Development of this Sector through modernization of new designing in calico craft.
 - It Provides or facilitates in providing the Credit Loans on easy terms to poor registered artisans.
 - Department facilitates in marketing of the handicrafts product through the Exhibition & Fairs at provincial, state, and District level.



SCHEMES OFFERED BY THE DEPARTMENT



State Sponsored Schemes



1. Interest subsidy

10% interest charged by banks on micro credit loans and Artisan Credit Loan availed by the registered artisans is subsidized by the Handicrafts Department under this scheme upto loan of one lac.

2. Exemption on stamp duty.

Upto Loan of 1.5 Lac to the registered artisans stamps duty exempted. Department sponsors loan to the registered artisans upto the limit of two 2.00 lac where under 10% interest subsidy provided upto 1.00 Lac.



District Sponsored Schemes

1. *Training Programs*

- Training provided to the un-employed youth in 8 no's training centres in District Samba.
- No of training centres under Adv. Course 2 No's and in Elementary course 6 No's.
- Each training centres has intake capacity of 25 No's trainees except Handloom Weaving Training Centre 20 No's.
- Stipend under Adv Course Scheme @ Rs 700 to each trainee where as Rs. 500 is paid per month under elementary course.
- The centers are mobile from one place to other on response basis.

ACHIEVEMENTS UNDER DIFFERENT SCHEMES



- Trainees Trained (2015-16)

Against a target of 195 a total of 112 persons were trained in different crafts during 2015-16.

- Organization of Co-operative Societies:

Two societies were registered against a target of five.

- 30 beneficiaries were provided loan under Micro Credit Plan and Artisan credit Card scheme.

- 93 Artisans Registered under different crafts. Bamboo 51 Nos, Shawl Emb 12 Nos, Chamba Craft 7 Nos, Leather Emb. 11 Nos, Handloom Weaving 12 Nos.

- Production during the year 2015-16 =1.565 Lac

- Sale during the year 2015-16 =1.346 Lac
